Eligibility: Summer Camp is open to all currently registered CYS school age children who attended grades 1-5 during the 2019/2020 school year. Enrollment: Summer camp enrollment is done on a weekly basis. Open enrollment is available to the eligible patrons beginning April 15th on MCC.com followed by registration at Parent Central Services for children not currently atteding CYS Before/After School Programs. Priority enrollment is given for children currently attending CYS Before/After Programs; beginning Monday, March 16th through April 3rd at the School Age Center, Bldg 260. All parents must attend a Summer Camp Orienttion prior to their child attending. Orientation schedules will be provided at the time of enrollment.

Billing Information: Camp fees are billed weekly and include all programming between the hours of 0545 and 1800, Monday through Friday. The School Age Center provides breakfast, lunch, and snack daily.

Cancellation Policy: Camp enrollment must be cancelled in writing, either in person at SAC (Bldg. 260), by fax (337-531-8120), or via email (chasity.l.hill.naf@mail.mil or barbara.a.kenebrew.naf@mail.mil) by noon, the Friday one week before the reserved week of camp. If you fail to cancel within the allotted time frame, you will be charged for the week of camp, regardless of attendance.
